ELECTION RESULTS 1871-1986

Votes

Although official election returns were most certainly announced prior to 1916 it was not until that date that they were published in any form that has survived and not until 1928 that the first Statement of Votes appeared. Consequently, before 1916 and to a certain extent even afterwards, unofficial sources have had to be used to obtain vote results.\(^1\) These have been cited, for both general and by-elections. All general election results since 1928 have been taken from the respective Statement of Votes. By-election results after 1952 are included in the Statement but as it is not always clear which one, this has been indicated. From 1928 to 1952 by-election results are to be found in a publication entitled Summary of Votes which appears to be a retrospective compilation by the Elections Branch of general and by-election results based upon official figures. Before 1928 various editions of the Canadian Parliamentary Guide, its predecessor the Canadian Parliamentary Companion, the Dominion Annual Register, and R.E. Gosnell's Year Book of British Columbia, and numerous newspapers of the period have provided figures. These sources have also been used to supply results of general elections before 1916. Their reliability and their completeness vary.

Due to the existence of multi-Member Electoral Districts, from 1871 to date, voters in those Districts have as many votes as seats to be filled. As a result, the number of total votes cast, both in the District and in the province as a whole, exceeds the number of voters who voted (i.e. ballots cast) or even the number of registered voters. Electors were not obliged to vote for a full slate (voting for fewer is known as plumping) so the total votes cast is not necessarily a multiple of the number of candidates and the number of voters who voted. The Statement of Votes gives the number of registered voters who voted in the multi-Member Districts for each election since 1928 except 1941. 1945 and 1953 but can be determined for these three. The figures have been provided in a separate section. In the "General Election Summary" for 1928-1986 an overall total for each election is to be found. Before 1928, in order to get a rough idea of the number of voters who cast ballots, one can divide the total number of votes by the number of seats. Due to probable plumping, however, this will only be an estimate. The percentage, or popular vote in multi-Member Districts has been calculated in all cases by using the number of votes rather than the number of ballots. The same is true for overall provincial party standings. For the 1952 and 1953 general elections the single transferable vote was employed. Those Districts electing more than one Member were issued separate ballots for each seat and candidates were divided among the ballots. Accordingly, it is possible to calculate the popular vote for each candidate as in single-Member Districts.

By votes is meant valid votes. The number of rejected ballots is taken from the *Statement of Votes* and until 1986 indicates the number of voters whose entire ballot was rejected. Before 1956 this figure was added to the total votes cast but this was inaccurate for multi-Member Districts. The figures are available for general elections since 1928 and for by-elections since 1952. In 1986 the number of rejected votes rather than ballots was counted for multi-Member Districts.

Candidates

The form of name has been standardized throughout. Given names are often lacking in early election returns, and sometimes in later ones. They have been supplied when known. Names have been determined and verified using newspapers, the Legislative Library Newspaper Index, Voters' Lists, the B.C. Journals (which names those elected), the B.C. Gazette (appointment notices), the Canadian Parliamentary Guide, the Statement of Votes, the List of Candidates (first printed in 1924), and candidates' disclosure statements (since 1975). Those candidates who withdrew before polling day have been omitted but those who withdrew during polling are included—and noted if known.

*Please note that reterence to use of a 'single transferable vote: system in the general election of 1952 and 1953 is not correct. As indicated in footnotes to the 1952 and 1953 election results, p. 240 inotinote 1 and p. 252 footnote 1, the system in use was actually an 'alternative voting' system.

¹ Figures given in [] indicate that they are incomplete. Figures in the table for 1921–1986 are taken mostly from the 1983 and 1986 Statement of Vales. In multi-Member Districts, voters could vote for more than one candidate which affects the number of valid votes. In 1916, 1941, and 1945 active service voting was extended beyond the polling day given here. In elections until 1900, polling day for certain Districts often varied from that for the rest of the province. This also occurred for two Districts in 1933. The active service vote cost in 1941 was \$2.88 per voter, in 1945, \$1.79 per voter. The percentage of voters who voted in the 1945 election appears to have omitted the active service voters. For 1986 the number of rejected ballots is actually the number of rejected votes, which due to dual candidate Districts is greater than the number of ballots. As well, the percentage is based on the number of votes, not ballots, cast.
