Donations and Estimated Median Donation to Six Main Federal Canadian Political Parties from 2016-2022

In 2016, the limit for a donation/contribution by an individual to each party was \$1,525 (plus an additional \$1,525 combined total to the riding associations of each party); in 2017 it was \$1,550; in 2018 it was \$1,575; in 2019 it was \$1,600; in 2020 it was \$1,625; in 2021 it was \$1,650, and in 2022 it was \$1,675. In contrast to this high donation limit, the five charts set out below show that the estimated median donation to the five main federal Canadian political parties during the five years from 2016 to 2020 inclusive was \$75.03 and during the seven years from 2016 to 2022 inclusive (including two election years, and including the People's Party of Canada in the calculations for 2021-2022) it was \$77.06.¹

Based on the statistics in Charts 1 to 9 set out further below, the high estimated median contribution through this seven-year period for each party was as

The number of parties used to calculate the averages increased in 2021 and 2022 to include the PPC after the party won the fifth highest share of votes in the 2021 election, ahead of the Green Party. The overall seven-year estimated median contribution to these main parties was \$77.06 (the average of the estimated median numbers across the seven-year period). It is an estimate because federal political parties are not required to disclose the exact amount donated by anyone who donates less than \$200 annually – the only figures provided by each party are the total donated annually in amounts under \$200, and the total number of donors who each gave under \$200 each year. From that, the average amount donated under \$200 was calculated, and then that amount was used in the calculation of the estimated media donation for each party annually. follows: Liberal Party - \$98.29 (2022); Conservative Party - \$105.07 (2021); New Democratic Party - \$91.66 (2022); Bloc Quebecois - \$77.57 (2021); Green Party - \$89.44 (2022); People's Party of Canada - \$62.17 (2021). The low estimated median contribution amount through this seven-year period for each party was as follows: Liberal Party - \$62.67 (2016); Conservative Party - \$80.37 (2022); New Democratic Party - \$48.59 (2017); Bloc Quebecois - \$61.50 (2016); Green Party - \$57.69 (2020); People's Party of Canada - \$60.20 (2022).

This seven-year period presents a recent representative average annual donation total for each main party because it includes three regular years, two election years (2019 and 2021 – during which donations usually increase), and two post-election years (during which donations usually decrease). The estimated median contribution is as close as possible to an accurate figure of the amount that most individuals can afford to give, or want to give. Based on the estimated median contribution through this seven-year period, the current annual donation limit (in 2024) of \$1,725 to each party plus \$1,725 to the riding associations of each party (i.e. \$3,450 total) is 45 times higher than what an average voter can afford to give.

The Charts also show, as summarized in Chart 1 below, that on average 73% of voters donate less than \$200 each year (estimated average of \$75 each); about 16% donate between \$200 and \$500; about 6% donate between \$500 and \$1,000; about 5% donate more than \$1,000, and; about 1% donate the maximum amount.

Based on the statistics from 2016-2022 set out in Charts 1-9 below, an individual donation limit that would align with the fundamental democratic principle of one person, one vote would be no more than \$77 annually. This amount should not be higher to allow a person to “hedge their bets” by donating to more than one party. One study showed only a small percentage of donors donate to more than one party

– from 1.7 percent of Liberals in 2017; 0.3 to 0.7 percent of Conservatives from 2016 to 2019, and; also in 2017, 1.8 percent of NDP supporters and 6.3 percent of Green Party supporters.²

Also, as Charts 2-9 set out below show, on average from 2016-2022 inclusive, only about 240,000 people (0.9 percent) donated annually to the six main federal political parties out of Canada’s approximate total of 27 million eligible voters through that time period.³ Overall, this indicates that only a small percentage can afford to, or want to, donate to any party or to more than one party, which also supports the argument for having an annual donation limit of no more than \$77.

Federal political parties are not required by any law to disclose the total number of members they have at any one time. The *Canada Elections Act* should be changed to require the parties to disclose this information quarterly in the same way that they are required to disclose their donors and donations every quarter, so that the public and the media can track changes in the level of support for each party as indicated by their total membership.

As shown by the statistics in Charts 1 and 2 below, based on the latest membership totals for the six main federal parties that the parties themselves have disclosed from 2014 (Bloc), 2017 (NDP), 2021 (PPC) on through 2022 (Conservatives, Greens and Liberals), the total estimated number of Canadians who belong to these six main parties is 1,074,620. If the parties could get 200,000 of these people to donate \$77 annually, they would raise much more than they

currently raise from people who donate \$1,000 or more annually, and if they could get all of them to donate \$77 annually, they would raise as much as they currently raise from people who donate \$200 or more annually. These statistics also support the argument for having an annual donation limit of no more than \$77.
