Dear Duff Conacher:

This is in response to your request under the *Access to Information Act*, which was received by this office on June 20, 2023, to obtain:

*As it did in February 2021 in a letter to the RCMP, Democracy Watch again requests records with regard to all decisions made concerning the examination and any subsequent investigations that have been undertaken, and all decisions concerning prosecuting anyone involved in the situation of the allegation that Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, former Finance Minister Bill Morneau, some members of their staff, and former Clerk of the Privy Council Michael Wernick obstructed justice by pressuring then-Attorney General Jody Wilson-Raybould to stop the prosecution of SNC-Lavalin. As mentioned in this recent media article: <https://www.theglobeandmail.com/politics/article-newly-released-documents-show-rcmp-considered-whether-to-charge-justin/> the RCMP has disclosed in response to an ATI Act request documents concerning the investigation into the trip gift given by the Aga Khan to Prime Minister Trudeau and his family. Given that the RCMP has disclosed documents concerning the investigation into the Aga Khan's trip gift, Democracy Watch requests that the same set of documents as has been disclosed with regard to the Aga Khan situation investigation be disclosed by the RCMP concerning its investigation into the SNC-Lavalin prosecution situation.*

Based on the information provided, a search for records was conducted in HQ Division and National Division. Unfortunately, we are unable to meet the extended time limit given in accordance with the Act, however, please note that further processing is continuing. Additional releases will be provided to you as they are completed.

In the interim, we are enclosing the information that has been processed to date. Please note that some of the information has been exempted pursuant to Section 23, Subsections 16(2), 19(1), Paragraphs 16(1)(b), 21(1)(a) of the *Access to Information Act*, a description of which can be found at: <http://laws-lois.justice.gc.ca/eng/acts/A-1>.

We also have an outstanding consultation to determine if certain documents contain Cabinet Confidences.


